Que and Pew 2010

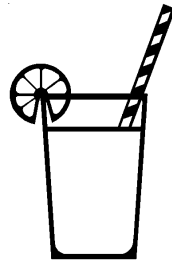

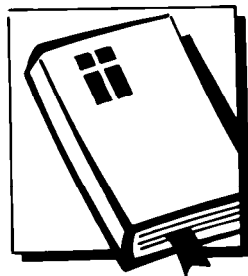
